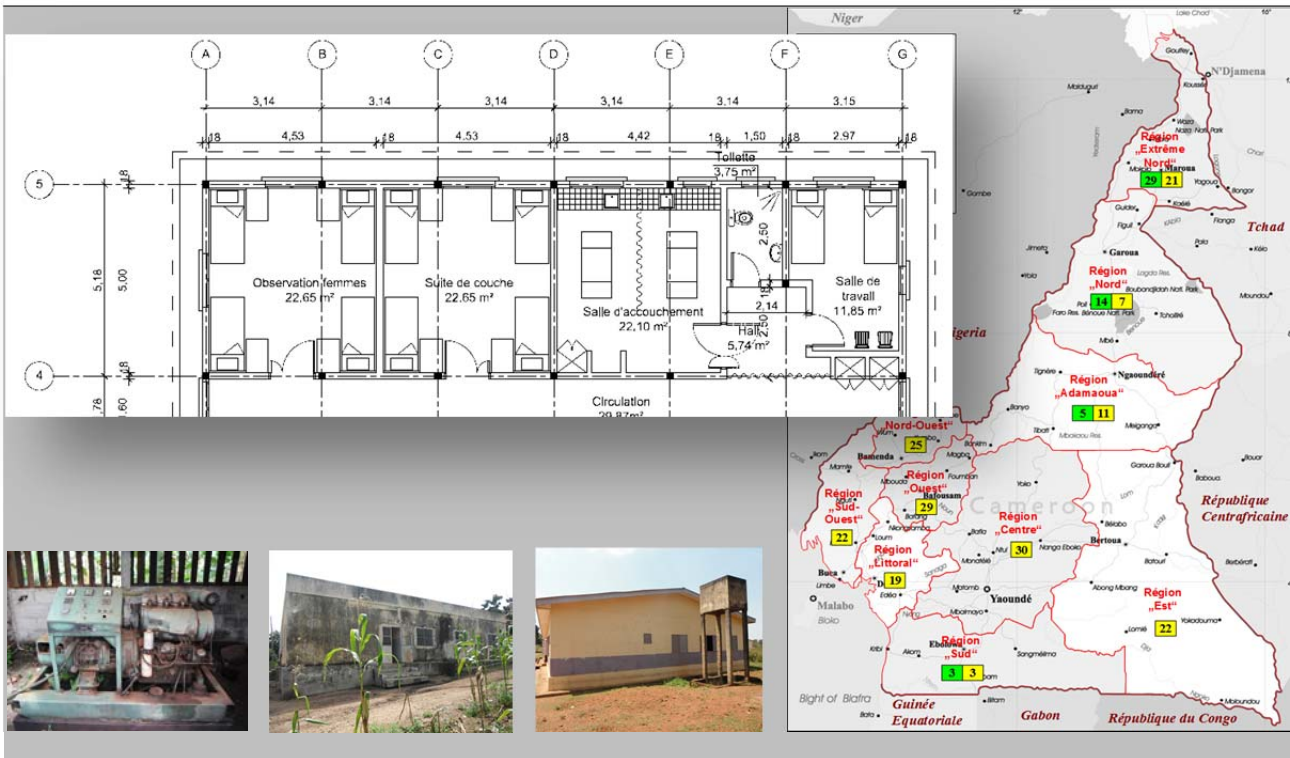

##### Phase 3

- Assistance to the contracting authority in contract award to construction companies and medical supplies and equipment companies

##### Phase 4

- Provisional and final acceptance of the works and equipment

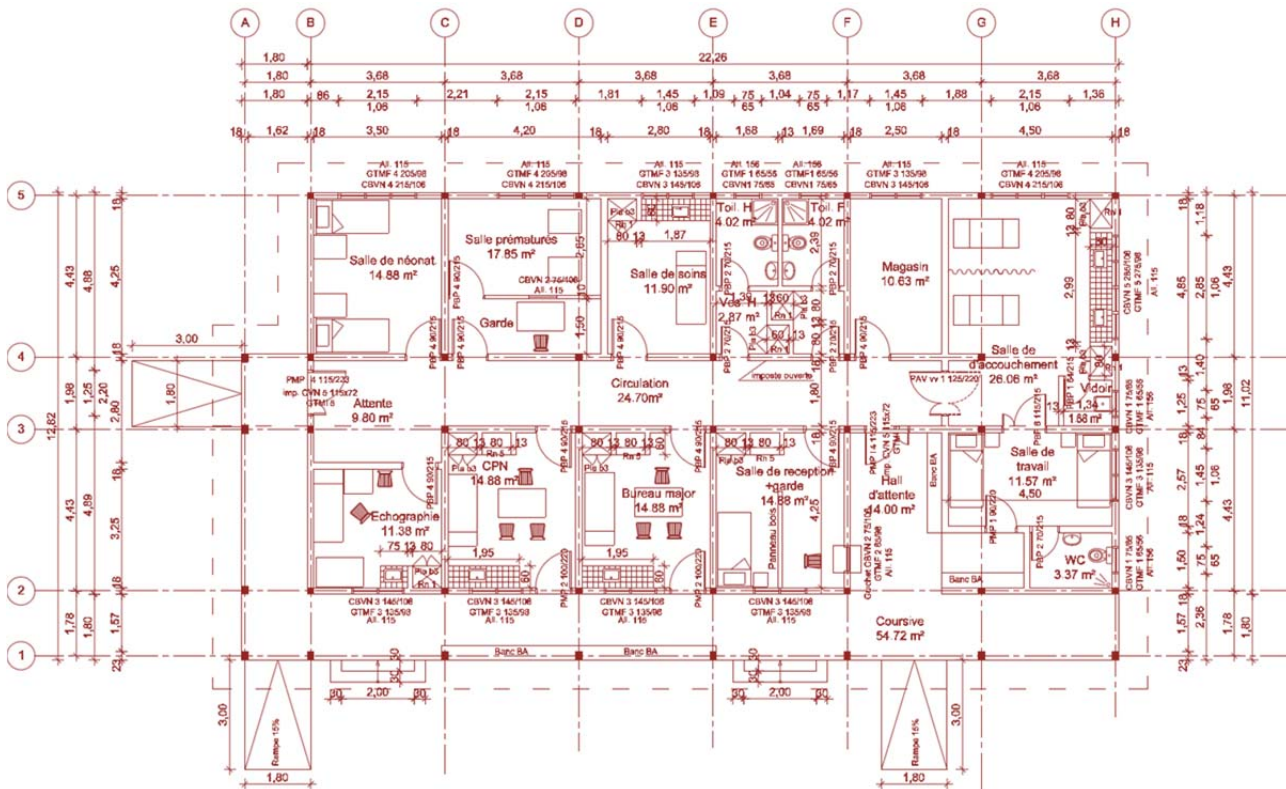
## Brief Project Description

Since 1978, the German Cooperation supports the development process of health sector in Cameroon. Since 1998, a Sector Health Programme (PSS I + II) was implemented by the Ministry of Public Health in two phases in the Northwest, South West and coastal region. Following intergovernmental negotiations in 2006 and 2008, funding was granted to continue this program in the context of a sector wide approach (SWAP). Providing health care as in the PSS II will be extended to the entire country.

The overall objective of the Health and Aids Program is to increase utilization and improve the quality of health services with a particular focus on child and maternal health and communicable diseases.

In the framework of the Joint AFD-KfW Program, the Assistant to the contracting authority/the Technical Coordinator will support the Ministry of Public Health in the programming of the public health infrastructure and in the coordination and follow-up of the local consulting firms responsible for planning, supervision of works and installation of equipment.

The program consists in financing the rehabilitation of existing health care centers (District Hospitals, District Medical Centers and Integrated Health Care Centers). New construction will be justified for staff houses for staff in remote areas. The infrastructure comprises nearly 200 sites in the 10 regions of the country.



The tasks assigned to the Assistant / Technical Coordinator are conducted in 4 phases:

- Phase 1: Planning of the project and preparation of the tender documents
- Phase 2: Coordination of the architectural and engineering design studies assigned to different consulting firms
- Phase 3: Assistance to the contracting authority in contract award to construction companies and medical supplies and equipment companies
- Phase 4: Coordination of the works during the construction phase as well as during delivery and installation of medical equipment
